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Graduate Outcomes Explained

The Workforce Investment Act provided the impetus for the Graduate Outcomes project to develop a system of consumer information. It is a collaborative effort among the Nebraska Department of Labor, the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education, all six of Nebraska's Community Colleges, all three State Colleges and the University of Nebraska – Kearney.

Who uses Graduate Outcomes information?

Prospective students planning their education need information to help select a college and major. Colleges and regulatory commissions need the information to improve educational programs in the state. Workforce Investment Boards, economic developers, and policy makers need information on labor supply to help meet the needs of businesses in Nebraska.

What does the Graduate Outcomes project tell me?

Results from the Graduate Outcomes project give a clearer picture of recent graduates' work location, earnings, and industry employment. Here are just a few examples of questions the Graduate Outcomes project can help answer:

- In which counties are graduates employed?
- What are the demographic characteristics of graduates?
- What industries employ recent graduates?
- Which fields of study produce graduates most likely to be employed in Nebraska?
- Which fields of study produce graduates with the highest wages?
- What are some characteristics of the businesses employing these recent graduates?

The Appendix of this publication contains detailed spreadsheets for participating institutions that include the percentage of graduates working in Nebraska plus earnings by field of study and degree. It also includes industry employment by major and degree along with earnings information.








All State Colleges • County Map



- 93% of all state college graduates with a post-master's certificate were found to be working in Nebraska, and earning a median annual income of \$87,500.
- Bachelor's degree holders from the state colleges earned an average median income that was about 45% less than master's degree holders.
- Master's degree holders from the state colleges earned an average median income that was about 48% less than post master's certificate holders.
- 92% of all state colleges' students who received a post master's certificate were male.
- Almost 86% of all state college graduates were white. 1.8% were Hispanic, 2.1% were black, and less than one percent were American Indian, Alaska Native, or Asian. 8.8% of state college students were of unknown race/ethnicity.

- The highest average annual wage was paid to state college graduates with a master's degree in Superintendency and Educational System Administration. Their average annual salary was \$84,234. All graduates with this degree were found to be working in the educational services industry.
- 27.9% of all state college graduates working in retail trade had bachelor's degrees in business administration and management. The average annual salary for these degree holders was \$27,794.
- Elementary Education and Teaching graduates made up 19.7% of all state college graduates working in the educational services industry. On average, they earned \$26,192.
- The only industry that did not employ business administration and management degree holders was the Real Estate and Rental and Leasing industry.

All State Colleges • Sector/Business Size Analysis




- The State College system has deep roots in educating educators. This heritage is most palpably reflected in the concentration of recent State College graduates in the public sector. State college students go on to become teachers and administrators in the public education system at both the state and local level year after year.
- The State College system also produces many graduates who go on to experience successful careers in Nebraska's private sector as well, but these represent a small percentage relative to recent State College graduates working in the public sector and to the same group of all employed Nebraskans.
- Recent state college graduates are more likely to be found in the employ of larger businesses and less like to work for medium and small sized employers than are employed Nebraskans in general.
- The concentration of employment of recent State College graduates in larger businesses may be due in part to their high propensity to be found employed in the Healthcare and Retail Trade Industries. Both of those industries include several of the state's larger employers.



Percentage Graduates by Age








- Minority graduates of Peru made more on average than did their white counterparts, even though proportionally fewer minorities graduated with master's degrees.
- 42.3% of minority graduates working in Nebraska in the first quarter of 2011 worked in the Manufacturing Industry.
- Female Master's degree earners were the most likely to be employed in Nebraska, with 81% of that group reporting wages in-state.
- All graduates were most likely to be found working in the Educational Services industry. The next most likely landing spot for females reporting wages in Nebraska in the first quarter of 2011 was the Social Assistance industry. For males it was the Manufacturing Industry.
- Graduates over 30 had an estimated average annual wage of \$40,962.




- Educational Services by far was the most common industry for Peru graduates working in Nebraska, with 59% working in the field.
- Only 22% of graduates working in the Educational Services industry were male.
- 54% of graduates working in the Educational Services were under 30.
- 73% of graduates working in the Health Care industry were female.
- 63% of graduates employed in Manufacturing were male.
- 94% of Master's degree graduates working in Nebraska were employed in Educational Services.
- 32% of Peru graduates working in Nebraska majored in Teacher Education and Professional Development, making it the most popular degree.

- The percentage of recent Peru State College graduates employed by local government is vastly greater than the analogous percentage of recent graduates of any other State School or Community College that provides data to Nebraska Department of Labor LMI. As a result, a smaller percentage of recent Peru State College graduates work for private entities than any other group studied.
- The majority of recent Peru State College graduates working for local governments were working in the Education field.
- While no other State or Community College reporting to Nebraska Department of Labor LMI showed a concentration of employment of recent graduates in firms with 100+ employees over 68%, the same concentration for recent graduates for Peru State College was at 80%.
- Concordantly, far fewer recent Peru State College graduates worked for medium and small sized employers than those other groups on a percentage basis.
- Utilities was the highest paying industry for Peru graduates working in Nebraska; paying over \$6,000 more annually than the next best paying industry, Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services.



Things To Know

Annualized wage records are found by taking the graduate's first quarter earnings multiplied by four. This is the same methodology used to estimate the service area earnings, using Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages data.

When there are small numbers of students in a program/major/industry, a few unusual results can dramatically affect percentages. To protect individual confidentiality, programs with fewer than four graduates will not be published. Non-publishable or unavailable data is denoted as “****” or “na” throughout the publication.

Wage matches are postponed to give graduates time to be working in a career field. There is also a lag time in obtaining unemployment insurance records. In general, for people working January through March, employers have approximately April through June to report the information. The Quarterly Census of Employment and Wage information is added July through September. Past experience tells us that if the queries are run at a later date, more employment is reported, allowing for more accurate and complete data.

Not all graduates can be found. If a graduate is not found it does not necessarily mean they are unemployed; it means they were not located in the search of Nebraska's Unemployment Insurance database. Individuals who are self-employed, work in occupations not covered by Unemployment Insurance, are enrolled in other postsecondary education and are not working, or work in another state are unlikely to be found in the database. An institution's proximity to bordering states may make some students less likely to be employed in Nebraska, and therefore, not found in Nebraska's Unemployment Insurance database.

Earnings may be for full- or part-time work. Earnings reported in the database include wages, salaries, bonuses, commissions and other income designated as earnings under Nebraska Unemployment law. Wages tend to be higher in some regions than others. The wage information listed relates to all individuals found working in Nebraska and may be influenced by strong regional variation.

It is not possible to tell if graduates are employed in occupations related to their education.

The CIP Code field identifies the six digit classification of instructional program (CIP) code for each field of study.

Data pertaining to the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and University of Nebraska-Omaha was not made available to the Department of Labor for this publication.
